

Ransome's Secret Water



Arthur Ransome, most famous for his children's sailing adventure Swallows and Amazons', also wrote two books which feature Pin Hill. In 'We Didn' Mean To Go To Sea' the children set off from Pin Mill in a young man's yacht promising not to leave the river. They loose their anchor in Harwich Harbour drift out to sea end up in Holland after surviving a storm in the North Sea.

'Secret Water' takes place in the Walton Backwaters.
The children expore the sheltered creeks and tideaways in

dinghies.

Adults and children alike enjoy the simple, old-fashioned drama of Ransome's novels. Their ability to inspire children to leave their computer games behind and enjoy real outdoor adventures has lead to a resurgence of interest.
